

Portland Police Bureau Going Pink in October to Support Breast Cancer Awareness Month - #PPBPink

The Portland Police Bureau, in support of Breast Cancer Awareness Month, is going pink throughout the month of October.

Officers in all divisions may be donning pink caps, undershirts, socks, bootlaces, and patches as a show of support for all those affected by breast cancer. Additionally, officers will have information cards available with some facts about breast cancer, including the importance of early detection and treatment and where to get more information.

The Portland Police Bureau has partnered with Susan G. Komen of Oregon & Southwest Washington to raise awareness and encourage early detection.

During the month of October, supporters of Breast Cancer Awareness Month are encouraged to have a conversation with officers wearing their pink, take pictures and share them on social media using the hashtag #PPBPink.
