Breast Cancer Forum – Eugene (October 7, 2018)



Keri Winters-Stone, PhD, who holds multiple roles between OHSU Knight Cancer Institute and School of Nursing, talked about exercise in survivorship to a full room at the Valley River Inn. As an exercise scientist, Dr. Winters-Stone's research focuses on the effects of cancer treatment on musculoskeletal health and cancer recurrence risk and the ability of exercise to improve health and longevity in cancer survivors. The long-term goal of her research is to develop prescriptive exercise programs for cancer survivors that meets their needs and preferences and optimizes their health outcomes.
